

SECTION 6: INTEGRATION OF AYUSH IN THE HEALTH CARE SYSTEM UNDER NATIONAL RURAL HEALTH MISSION (NRHM)

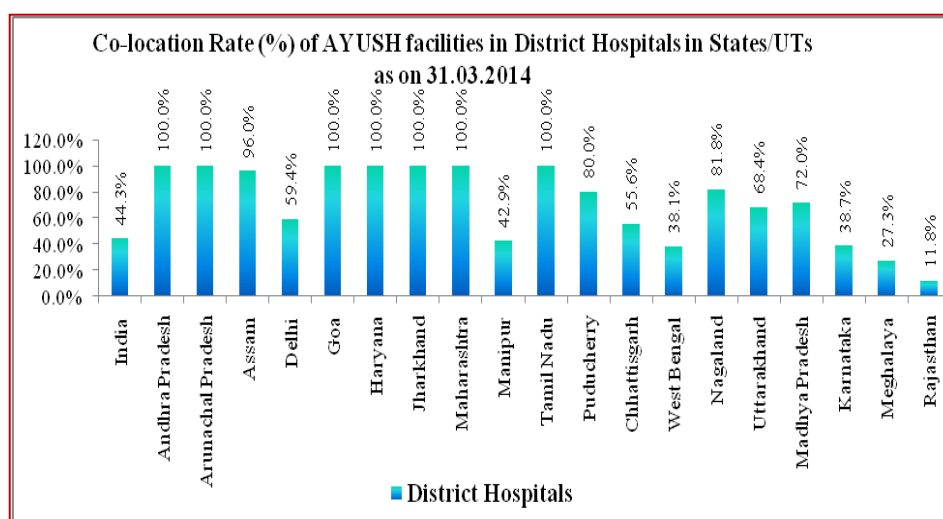
After the launch of NRHM, an initiative has been taken by the Department of Health & Family Welfare and Ministry of AYUSH for strengthening of health care facilities at all levels by integrating AYUSH systems in national health care delivery systems under NRHM.

Physical and functional integration of AYUSH systems in NRHM is most important strategy of Mainstreaming under NRHM. Integration is facilitated by appointing or collocating AYUSH doctors & supporting staff and creating infrastructure according to local needs. AYUSH doctors who are being appointed are used to facilitate management of programmes, monitoring and effective implementation of various interventions under NRHM.

As on March, 2014 there were 659 districts, 5564 blocks and 640867 villages incorporating 748 District Hospitals (DHs), 5187 Community Health Centres (CHCs) and 24448 Primary Health Centres (PHCs) in India. The rural population of India for 31ST March, 2014 has been estimated as 8646.34 lakhs. On an average, 11.6 lakhs, 1.7 lakhs and 0.4 lakhs rural population had been served per District hospital, Community Health Centre, Primary Health Centre respectively.

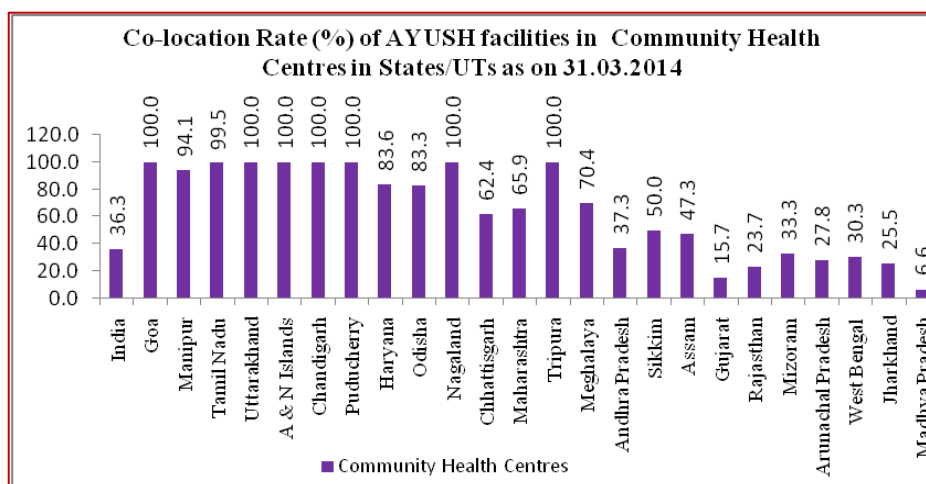
Co-location Rate of Rural Health Infrastructure with AYUSH facilities in India:

AYUSH facilities had been co-located with 331 District Hospitals, 1885 Community Health Centre's and 8461 Primary Health Centre's in the country in 2014. About 44.3% District hospitals had been co-located with AYUSH facilities till 2014. All the District hospitals existing in the states and union territories of Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Goa, Haryana, Jammu & Kashmir, Jharkhand, Maharashtra, Mizoram, Sikkim, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, A & N Islands, Chandigarh, Daman & Diu and Lakshadweep had been co-located with AYUSH facilities, whereas, the states having more than 50% of the District hospitals co-located with AYUSH facilities were, Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland and Puducherry.



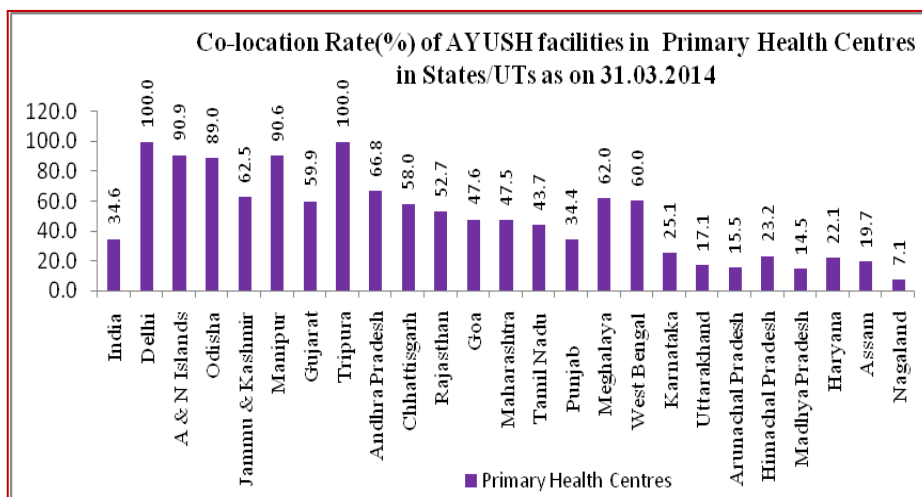
Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Goa, Haryana, Jammu & Kashmir, Jharkhand, Maharashtra, Mizoram, Sikkim, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, A & N Islands, Chandigarh, Daman & Diu and Lakshadweep had been co-located with AYUSH facilities, whereas, the states having more than 50% of the District hospitals co-located with AYUSH facilities were, Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland and Puducherry.

Nearly 36.3% Community Health Centre's had been co-located with AYUSH facilities till 2014. All the CHCs existing in the states and union territories of Goa, Nagaland, Tripura, Uttarakhand, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Lakshadweep and Puducherry had been



co-located with AYUSH facilities, whereas, the states having more than 50% of the CHCs co-located with AYUSH facilities were Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Maharashtra, Manipur, Meghalaya, Odisha, Sikkim and Tamil Nadu. The states having less than 25% CHCs co-located with AYUSH facilities were Gujarat, Jammu & Kashmir, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan only. No co-location of AYUSH facilities had been observed in CHCs in the remaining 5 states and union territories (Bihar, Delhi, Karnataka, Kerala and Uttar Pradesh).

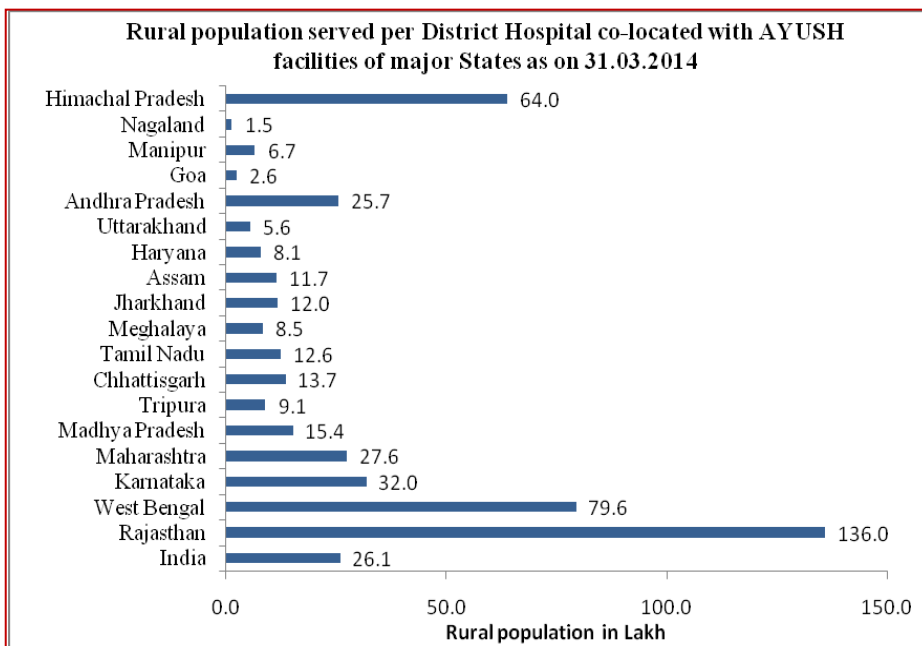
About 34.6% Primary Health Centre's had been co-located with AYUSH facilities till 2014. All the PHC existing in the Union Territory of Delhi, Tripura, D & N Haveli, Lakshadweep and Puducherry have been co-located. The States/ union territories having more than 50% of the PHCs co-located with AYUSH facilities were Andhra Pradesh,



States having more than 25% but less than 50% of the PHCs co-located with AYUSH facilities were Goa, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Punjab Tamil Nadu and Daman & Diu. No co-location with AYUSH facilities had been observed in the PHCs in the remaining 5 states and union territories (Bihar, Kerala, Mizoram, Uttar Pradesh and Chandigarh).

Rural Population served by the Rural Health Infrastructure co-located with AYUSH facilities:

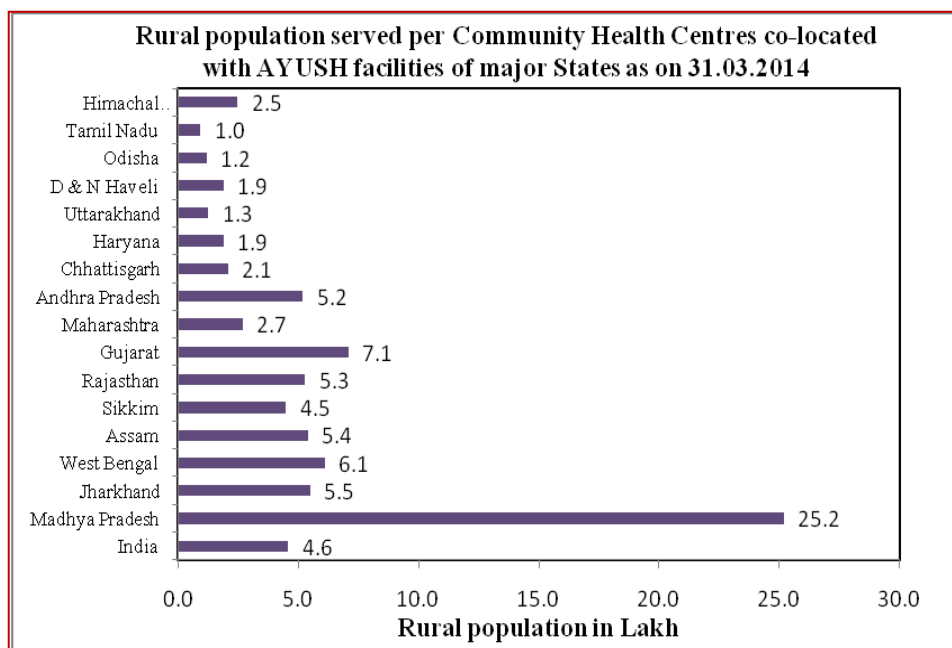
About 26.1 lakhs of rural population were being served by each District hospital co-located with AYUSH facilities in the country as on 31.03.2014. About 136 lakh, 79.6 lakh and 64 lakh population per DH co-located with AYUSH facilities were served in the state of Rajasthan West Bengal and Himachal Pradesh respectively. States where more than 10 lakhs but less than 32 lakhs rural population were served per DH co-located with AYUSH



facilities were the state of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu. The States and Union territories with less than 5 lakh rural populations getting their health care services per DH co-located with AYUSH facilities were Arunachal

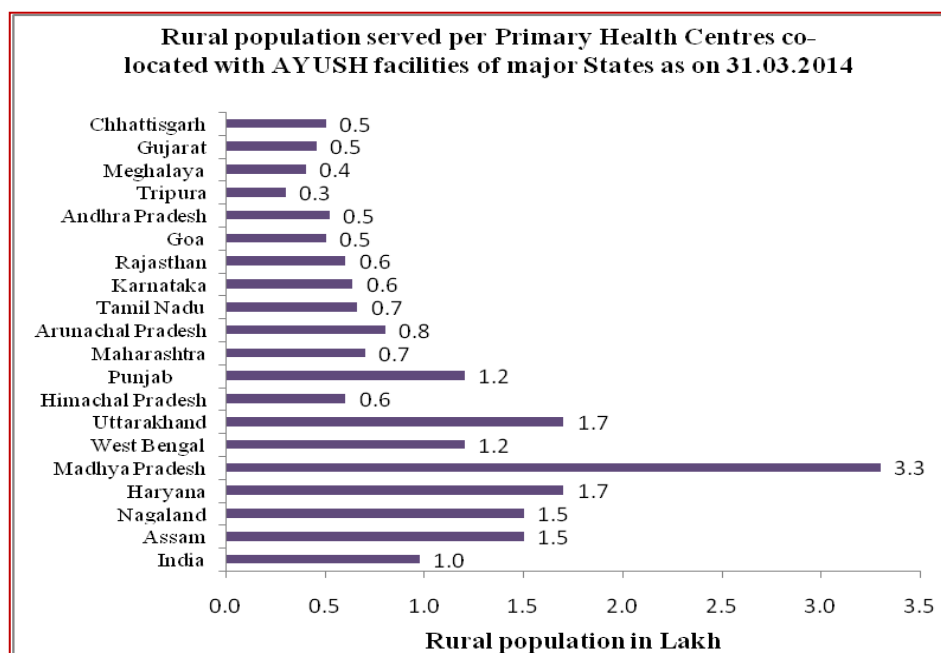
Pradesh, Delhi, Goa, Jammu & Kashmir, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim, A&N Islands, Chandigarh, Daman & Diu and Puducherry. Remaining 8 states and union territories have no DH co-located with AYUSH Facilities.

About 4.6 lakh of rural population were being served per Community Health Centre co-located with AYUSH facilities in 2014. About 25.2 lakh population per CHC co-located with AYUSH facilities were being served in the state of Madhya Pradesh, whereas, 7.1 lakhs, 6.1 lakhs, 5.2 lakhs, 5.4 lakhs, 5.5 lakhs, 5.3 lakhs and 4.5 lakhs rural population were being served per CHC co-located



with AYUSH facilities in the states of Gujarat, West Bengal, Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Jharkhand, Rajasthan and Sikkim respectively. The states and union territories with less than 3.0 lakh rural populations per CHC co-located with AYUSH facilities were Arunachal Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Maharashtra, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Odisha, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, Uttarakhand, A&N Islands, Chandigarh, D & N Haveli and all UTs except Lakshwadeep. Remaining 5 States and 1 UTs have no CHC co-located AYUSH Facilities.

On an average, 1.0 lakh of rural population were being served per Primary Health Centre co-located with AYUSH facilities in the country in 2014. About 3.3 lakh, 1.7 lakh, 1.7 lakh, 1.5 lakhs 1.5 lakh and 1.2 lakh populations per PHC co-located with AYUSH facilities were served in the states of Madhya Pradesh, Haryana, Uttarakhnad, Nagaland, Assam Punjab and West Bengal respectively.

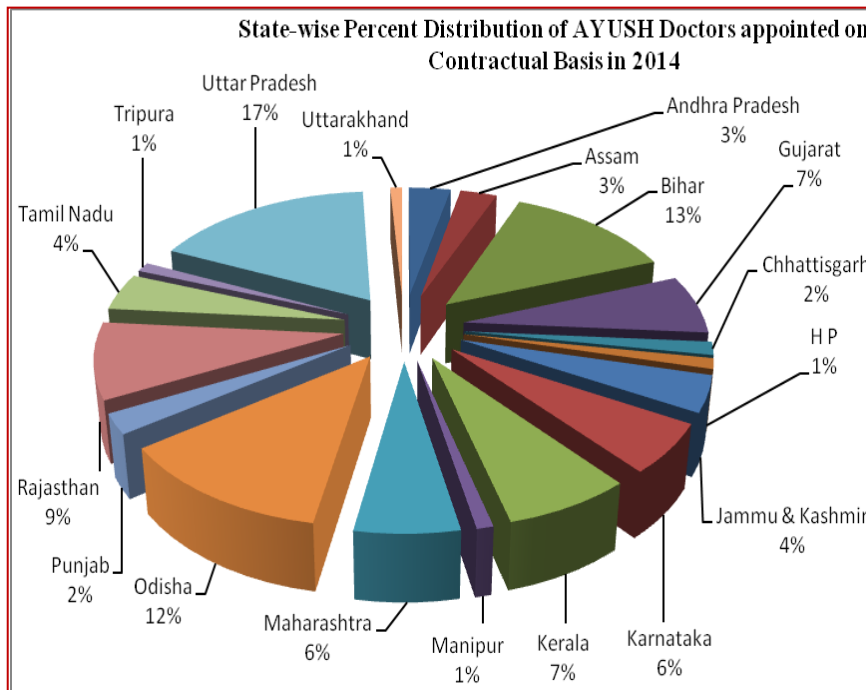


The remaining states and union territories were having less than one lakh rural population per PHC co-located with AYUSH facilities are Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, J&K, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Manipur, Meghalaya, Odisha, Rajasthan,

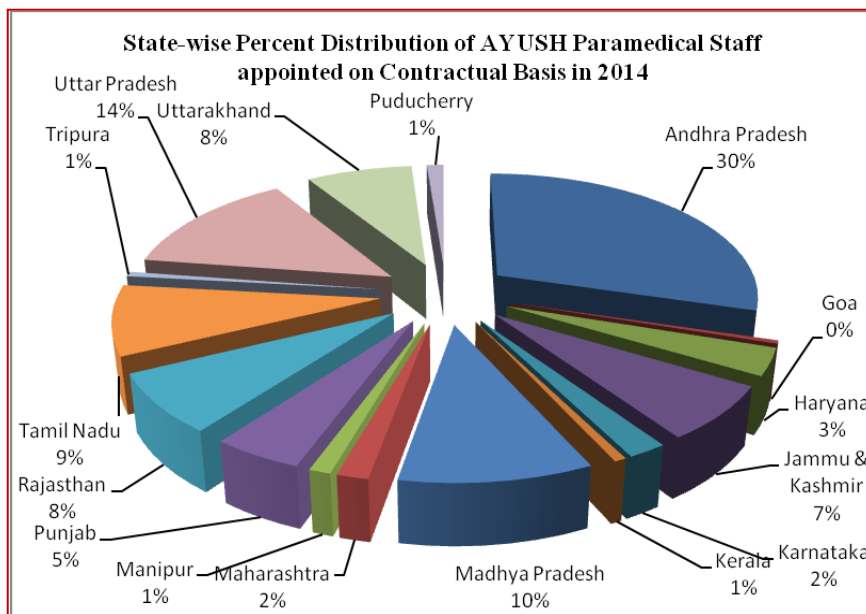
Tamil Nadu, Tripura, A&N Islands, D&N Haveli, Daman & Diu, and Puducherry. However, Bihar, Delhi, Kerala, Mizoram, Uttar Pradesh, Chandigarh and Lakshadweep were having no PHC co-located with AYUSH facilities.

Contractual Appointment of AYUSH Doctors and Paramedical Staff in India:

As on 31.03.2014, contractual appointment of 10933 AYUSH Doctors and 5419 AYUSH Paramedical staff has been recorded. Maximum 1829 AYUSH Doctors were appointed in the State of Uttar Pradesh whereas 1384 and 1316 contractual appointments of AYUSH Doctors had been observed in the states of Bihar and Odisha respectively. States having contractual Doctors ranging from 500 to 1000 are Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra and Rajasthan. The States having more than 250 and less than 500 contractual appointment doctors are Andhra Pradesh, Assam, J&K, Punjab and Tamil Nadu. Arunachal Pradesh, Delhi, Goa, Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal and Daman Diu is only five States and one UTs where there is no contractual AYUSH Doctor,



Likewise, 5419 contractual appointments of AYUSH Paramedical Staff was recorded at India till date 31.03.2014. Maximum 1584 paramedical staff was appointed in the state of Andhra Pradesh, whereas 733, 526, 475, 413 and 401 paramedical staff appointed in Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Uttarakhand and Rajasthan respectively. Only Jammu & Kashmir and Punjab State having contractual appointed paramedical staff ranging from 200 to 400. There was 11 States/UTs where no AYUSH Paramedical staffs



appointment on contractual base as on 31.03.2014 in Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Delhi, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Mizoram, Nagaland, West Bengal, D & N Haveli and Daman & Diu.
